The Alliance is designed to bridge the gap between countries in need of assistance and those offering expertise, resources, or financial support to tackle these issues effectively.

About the Global Alliance Against Hunger and Poverty

Purpose:

The Alliance is established to:

- **Connect countries** facing hunger and poverty with partners that can offer **expertise** or **financial support**.
- Focus on creating and implementing **public policies** aimed at eradicating hunger and poverty worldwide.
- Foster **collaboration** to address these challenges comprehensively through innovative solutions and partnerships.

Function:

The Alliance serves as a **collaborative platform** that works toward:

- **Eradicating hunger and poverty globally** by fostering cooperation across nations, organizations, and financial institutions.
- Promoting **food security** and improving **nutrition**, ensuring that more people have access to sufficient, nutritious food.
- Mobilizing **resources** and **knowledge** to generate tangible, large-scale impacts.

Membership and Structure:

- **Members:** 148 in total, comprising:
 - **82 countries**, including early members such as **Brazil** and **Bangladesh**.
 - The **African Union** and **European Union**.
 - **24 international organizations** (such as the UN and WHO).
 - **9 financial institutions** (like the World Bank and regional development banks).
 - **31 philanthropic and non-governmental organizations** (NGOs).
- **Inclusivity:** The Alliance has been **open to non-G20 countries since July 2024**, enabling global participation.
- **Global Reach:** The membership spans all continents, with representatives from diverse regions, fostering an inclusive approach to addressing global hunger and poverty.

Key Pillars of the Alliance:

1. **National:** Fostering the coordination of **public policies** specifically aimed at **eradicating hunger** at the national level. Countries will work together to design strategies that cater to their unique needs.

Despite these ambitious global goals, projections indicate that by **2030, 622 million people** will still be living below the extreme poverty line of **\$2.15 per day**. This highlights the urgent need for coordinated, multi-stakeholder action to achieve the SDGs and combat global inequality.
