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Why is in news? Russian Ram Leela treat for PM in Ayodhya

Ramlila is a **performance of the Ramayana epic** in a series of scenes that include song, narration, recital, and dialogue.

It was included in the UNESCO'S List of Intangible Cultural Heritage in 2008.

It is performed across northern India **during the festival of Dussehra**, held each year according to the ritual calendar in autumn.

Ayodhya, Ramnagar, and Benares, as well as Vrindavan, Almora, Sattna, and Madhubani, have the most typical Ramlila.

The **Ramayana** is based on the **Ramacharitmanas**, which is one of the most popular narrative genres in the country's north.

**Tulsidas** authored this sacred poem devoted to the glory of Rama, the hero of the Ramayana, in a kind of Hindi in the sixteenth century to make the **Sanskrit epic** accessible to all.

Since 1972, **Bakshi ka Talab** has hosted **another one-of-a-kind Ramlila**, near Lucknow, where Rama, Lakshman, and Hanuman are the main protagonists **Muslim teenagers are playing**, which is a significant deviation from the norm.

This 'Us gaon ki ramlila' has also been made as a radio drama, to develop a sense of community among the people.
